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Medical Prognosis: Poor: Morbid Obesity, OSA on 50% VM, B/L Lymphedema w/ LE Cellulitis s/p CVA and currently unable to take po or consistently answer questions or follow commands appropriately. When asked if he was "Short of breath", "in pain" or "in a hospital" he nodded "Yes", but when asked if he was "at home", "not in pain" or "wanting to eat" he did not move his head but rather stared and offered no response. He did not raise an arm when asked to do so.

Family Concerns: I spoke w/ [REDACTED] who specifically requested that neither the attorney or any friends be given any information but to refer them to him. [REDACTED] was very very appropriate in his concern for his brother's welfare and wanting to honor his wishes regarding no longterm feeding tube or placement in [REDACTED] w/ hospice.

After being in Connecticut at the bedside, [REDACTED] returned to California and his sister returned to her home yesterday. He stated that my observation of [REDACTED] inconsistent responses was observed by both he and his sister. However, given his current lack of nutrition, the uncertainty regarding [REDACTED] comprehension of what is being asked of him and subsequent longterm prognosis, we agreed to temporarily use the Cortrak for both meds and nutrition w/ reassessment early next week. We agreed that should his condition worsen or [REDACTED] repeatedly pull out the tube that we would reassess this plan.

Spiritual Concerns: Presbyterian as per POA. Church friends visit often.

Future Discharge Planning: Uncertain at this time.
